

Fire

The Black Fire is at approximately 268,218 acres with 29% containment.

Smoke

Winds in the area from the west-southwest increasing in the afternoon. Winston and Chloride will continue to see moderate smoke in the area. Gila Cliff Dwellings area will continue to see moderate to USG smoke at periods due to light winds. Possibly clearing out in the late afternoon with southwest winds. Truth or Consequences and Caballo will have early moderate air quality clearing out in the afternoon. Haze continues as southwest winds push smoke into the area. Moderate to USG smoke impacts will continue in the areas of Lake Roberts, Mimbres, Hanover, Kingston and San Lorenzo. They will have periods of smoke lingering until winds pick up in the afternoon out of the southwest. Possible periods of USG smoke when winds increase later today. Silver City will see good air quality with SW winds. See below links for more information.
